Mayor Whaley invited Ms. Diane Farrell, Director of External Relations and Development with Dayton Metro Library, Mr. James Saleem, Director of Community Initiatives, The Collaboratory, Mr. Fadi Shoukri, Owner of Mediterranean Grill, and Ms. Monica Harris, Welcome Dayton Coordinator, Human Relations Council, to the podium to provide a community update on the Ethnic Dining Guide.

Ms. Harris said the Human Relations Council exists to administer culture fairness, equal treatment and equal access for all who live, work and play in the City of Dayton.

Ms. Harris said the Welcome Dayton portion of the Human Relations Council, which is an immigrant integration initiative, works to integrate immigrants into the Dayton region by promoting businesses and economic development, equality in the justice system and in government, and access to education, social and health services.

Ms. Farrell said to better serve the immigrant and refugee population, a partnership was formed with the Dayton Metro Library, Collaboratory and Ethnosh Dayton. She said they launched a new initiative "Trace Your Roots" which is an interactive exhibit that explores immigrating to the U.S., celebrating cultural traditions, and researching family history. In addition to the initiative, a guide was created to serve as a resource to help explore the many ethnic and independent eateries in the area.

Mr. Saleem said Ethnosh was started in South Carolina to give people an opportunity to dine in a refugee or immigrant owned restaurant, and it offers an owner an opportunity to tell their story.

Mr. Shoukri said he is originally from Palestine, started his business three years ago in Harrison Township and has since relocated to the City of Dayton.

Mayor Whaley thanked them for their great collaboration and wished them well.

Mayor Whaley invited Dr. Michael Sullivan, Associate Superintendent, Dayton Public Schools, Mr. John Rogers, Coordinator, Dayton Public Schools, to the podium to give a community update on the Males of Color Summit.
