



Dayton City Commissioner Joey D. Williams resigns

Tonight at the Dayton City Commission meeting, Commissioner Joey D. Williams announced his resignation.

Williams's resignation will be effective Friday, Feb. 23. Williams, who assumed the role of market president for KeyBank in November of 2017, cited his new job responsibilities for his resignation.

"This decision was very difficult to make," said Commissioner Williams. "However, as I have adjusted to the responsibilities of my new job, it has become clear that I will not be able to dedicate the time and focus that the Dayton community deserves from its commissioners."



Williams has served on the City Commission since 2002. His background in financial management led him to initiate a monthly financial review committee. Through his leadership and oversight, Dayton has been recognized as one of the financially strongest cities in Ohio.

Additionally, in 2011 he spearheaded the Community-Police Council (CPC) to improve the working relationship between the community and police.

"Being a part of the Dayton City Commission for the past 16 years has been an honor. I am especially proud to have served with this Commission and the community as we won the All American Cities award in 2017," said Commissioner Williams.

"Joey has served the City of Dayton with distinction, and his presence on our team will be greatly missed," said Mayor Nan Whaley. "We wish him all the best."
