



Police major graduates from FBI National Academy

Dayton Police Department Major Eric Henderson recently graduated from the 274th session of the FBI National Academy at Quantico, VA. Henderson, a Dayton native and 19-year veteran of the Department, currently serves as division commander of the West Patrol Operations Division. He previously served in patrol and as a field training officer, sergeant, lieutenant, and bomb squad technician.

The 11-week FBI National Academy, which began Oct. 1, includes coursework in managing organizational change, navigating leadership crises, constitutional law, and managing law enforcement image. The program seeks to improve the administration of justice in police departments and agencies at home and abroad and to raise law enforcement standards, knowledge and cooperation worldwide.



In addition to Major Henderson, the academy graduated 248 participants representing federal and local law enforcement in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, military agencies, and 23 other countries.
