



Dayton Municipal Court to host June 14 event to reinstate driver licenses

On Friday, June 14, from noon to 3:30 p.m., the Dayton Municipal Court will host a one-day event to assist people with the process of reinstating their driver license. During this event, qualified participants will receive individual, step-by-step assistance to clear obstacles and be considered for amnesty or a reduction in BMV reinstatement fees.

The Road to Success event is presented in conjunction with Ohio BMV's statewide Reinstatement Fee Amnesty Initiative, a fee debt reduction and waiver program for offenders whose driver licenses have been suspended for specific violations. The program ends July 31, 2019, and requires all other conditions of court-ordered suspensions to have been met.

"Our goal with this event is to remove as many barriers to the reinstatement process as possible," said Mark Owens, Dayton Municipal Court clerk of court. "We are bringing more than one dozen organizations and 100 volunteers into the courthouse to take care of all eligibility issues in one place."

Among the organizations attending will be the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Advocates for Basic Legal Equality, Greater Dayton Volunteer Lawyers Project, Legal Aid of Western Ohio, Miami Valley Community Action Partnership, Montgomery County Job and Family Services and Child Support Enforcement Agency, Ohio Legal Assistance Foundation, insurance agencies, a traffic school, as

well as judges and clerks from Dayton, Kettering, and Montgomery County East and West Municipal Courts.
