



## City cancels boil advisory for downtown

The water boil advisory for City of Dayton water customers located in the downtown area is canceled. City of Dayton water customers in this area do not need to boil water prior to consumption.

The boil advisory remains in effect for areas of Belmont and Patterson Park which were impacted by the water service interruption. Water samples for that area are currently undergoing test and customers will be notified later today of results.

An updated map showing areas that are clear or remaining under an advisory is available at [daytonohio.gov/waterupdate](http://daytonohio.gov/waterupdate). City water customers may call 333-4905 to confirm their status if needed.

As of 6:30 a.m. today, all water samples collected by the City of Dayton for the downtown area were absent of bacteria.

City customers are advised of the following before using tap water:

- If water has not been used for several hours, run the tap until there is a noticeable temperature drop.
- Then, run water for 30 seconds to 3 minutes before using it for drinking and cooking. This helps flush water that may have contained lead that may have leached from plumbing.
- Clean your faucet aerator. Flushing water lines includes interior and exterior faucets, showers, water and ice dispensers.
