



Dayton City Hall closed for repairs November 13 & 16

-City making upgrades to electrical infrastructure-
-911 service not affected-

On Friday, Nov. 13, and Monday, Nov. 16, Dayton City Hall (101 W. Third St.) will be closed to the public.

The closure is to allow for electrical infrastructure upgrades to the building. The project will require a complete electrical shutdown of City Hall. The City will resume normal operations Tuesday, Nov. 17.

911 emergency dispatch will not be affected by the building closure. Other City facilities including the One Stop Center, recreation centers, police and fire stations, and the Dayton Municipal Court will operate as usual.

During the shutdown, the City's customer call center will be closed. However, residents may call 937-333-4800 for waste collection and street maintenance service requests or concerns.

Residents are encouraged to use the City's customer service app ([Dayton Delivers 2.0](#)) to report non-emergency requests. The free app can be downloaded from app stores.

Customers making payments for water service may pay through paytondaytonwater.com, by mail, by the interactive voice response system at 937-333-3550, or at Family Dollar or CVS stores.

Appointments with City personnel at City Hall will be rescheduled. Income tax payments can be made by credit card only at daytonohio.gov/paytax.

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
