



Sobriety Checkpoint Changed to Saturation Patrols

The sobriety checkpoint planned for tonight (Wednesday, November 25) in Dayton has been changed to saturation patrols across the city.

There will not be a single checkpoint in Dayton tonight, but instead there will be enhanced patrols specifically looking for impaired drivers. This change will allow officers to focus traffic safety efforts on numerous locations. The saturation patrols will be concentrated in the 6-10pm timeframe.

We remind citizens of the statewide curfew that begins at 10pm.
