



Police Department Helps Local Families with Annual Angel Tree

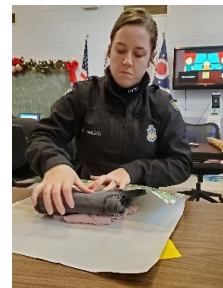
