As a next step in implementing Dayton police reform recommendations, the Human Relations Council and the Dayton Police Department will host the next "Know Your Rights" session on Thursday, Jan. 6, 2022, at 6 p.m., at the Dayton Metro Library Madden Hills Branch (2542 Germantown St., conference room).
